OBITUARY WILLIAM M. BEARD

Funeral services for William Beard were held at the home of his brother last Friday morning at 9 o'clock by Rev. O. P. Blackwell, pastor of the Buffalo Methodist Episcopal Church. The body was then taken to Bartlesville by Arvid T. Temple, mortician, and services were held there by the Baptist minister of that place at 10:30 A. M. Saturday. Burial was beside his wife in the cemetery at Dewey, Okla.

William M. Beard was born October 18, 1859, in Decatur



Miller, the son of her brother Charles, assisted by the attorney, Oscar G. Miller, son of Augustus. The family data gathered for the purpose of settlement of the estate has been a great help in the history work. 



I had the pleasure of making two visits to the home of Cousin Anna B. Johnston. The first one was in the fall of 1866. I was 13 years old at the time. My father, mother, sister, America, and I arrived at her home near Unionville, Mo., on a Friday evening in a covered wagon, having driven there from Greensburg, Ind. The next day, Saturday, I went out to hunt prairie chickens. I failed to find any, but met a boy about three-fourths of a mile from the house. He asked me what I was doing. I told him I was out hunting prairie chickens. He said to me, "If you found any you could not hit them." I replied, "I could try." He then hung his hat on a fence and said to me, "You can't hit that hat." I told

him I thought I could. "You try it." I replied, "I do not want to shoot up your hat." "You can't hit it," he declared again. The bantam and the way it was said was too much for me and I leveled the gun on the hat and riddled it. The report of the gun brought his dog. "Well, you can't hit the dog," said the boy. "I don't want to kill your dog," I replied. "You can't hit him," he said. At these words I let the other barrel go and killed the dog. When I went to the house the folks asked, "Where are the chickens?" I replied, "I did not find any." "We heard you shoot twice. What were you shooting at?" they inquired. And then I told them. My mother gave me a lecture for shooting up the boy's hat and killing the dog. Then Cousin Anna came to my defense, saying, "I had hoped someone would kill that dog as it gets all my eggs."

The next morning mother gave me the usual Sunday morning scrubbing and sent me out to the prairie schooner to change clothes and while there seven prairie chickens lit in a small tree right close to the wagon. I got the gun and was tempted to break the Sabbath. But I had been too well trained and I put the gun away. We all went to a schoolhouse to meet some distance away. When we got there the house was full and more than enough outside to fill it again. The next morning we hit the trail for Uncle Joe Miller's in Nodaway County, Missouri.

The second visit was made in 1915, forty-nine years having elapsed since the first one. Cousin Anna had changed from a young, vigorous woman to an old, feeble one, living in Unionville, Mo., with her daughter, Laura Patterson, and her husband, Frank, and brother Westerfield. Cousin Anna displayed an old cotton bedspread that Grandmother Elizabeth Swope Miller^a had made from raw material before she and grandfather moved to Indiana, in 1824. It was a very interesting relic of grandmother's handiwork. She and Columbus were members of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Rebecca was the mother of one daughter, Bertha Viola Lyons, who was born in Davis County, Iowa, July 21, 1873, who was very badly deformed. She used her toes to do needle work and write. After partaking of a bountiful repast the relatives again journeyed to Miller's Chapel, four miles south and visited the chapel that Grandfather George Miller built and gave to the community. The cemetery lies in the same yard and here is found their grandfather's grave and graves of several other ancestors.

A RINGING LETTER FROM REV. D. D. PROPER
In Memory of a Comrade in Arms.

Topeka, Kansas, March 25, 1887.

Sloan & Rowley,

Dear Sirs:—A recent copy of your paper was sent to me (by friends in Iowa) containing an account of the death of Will Spraker, Company I, Nineteenth Iowa Infantry Volunteers. I belonged to that company and regiment, and am impressed to write a line of tribute to his memory. He was a true, faithful soldier, and in common with the rest of us suffered great hardships. I well remember seeing Will Spraker, while a prisoner, making the march from Tyler, Texas, to Shreveport, La., during the winter of 1863-4, over the frozen roads, bare-footed, until his feet were bruised, turning purple in spots, and torn and bleeding. It was an exceptionally severe winter that year for that country, and the ground was frozen, being covered with ice and sharp hubs. Without even overcoats or blankets we made that march, lying by the fires in the open air at night without coverings or shelter of any kind. Will had no shoes and had to march over these frozen walks without them. I do not remember that a murmur escaped his lips.

He had the spirit of the true, loyal soldier, enduring all this patiently for his country. There were a number of other noble, loyal men of the Nineteenth Iowa, Company I, who suffered untold privations on this trip. I saw the officer in charge draw his revolver and threaten to shoot one of the poor, half-famished boys for stepping a few feet over the line to get a cup of water from the creek. I am the more impressed to write these few lines because of the great change that seems to be coming over the people of our country in these days. It seems that many of those, even in the North, who certainly have every reason to feel grateful to the soldiers of twenty-five years ago are forgetting the great purchase price paid for the redemption and the deliverance of our country. It cost separations, tears, self-denials and privations of every kind, and a loss of life blood from loyal soldiers to secure this end. Once it was honorable to be a soldier, but now they are

characterized by even legislators in our halls of Congress as "vagabonds," "cowards," "coffee coolers," "bounty jumpers," "scum of the earth." When the friends of the soldiers tried to get some recognition of the claims of these men who "wore the blue," and their dependent wives and children, by a government, made safe and rich by their bloody deeds of sacrifice, so rich that the officials do not know what to do with the money in the large vaults, this is the way they are characterized, and the bill that would have given Will Spraker's wife and orphan children a meager pittance, is defeated by the veto of an unsympathizing President. If there is a soldier in the country who made these marches and endured these terrible hardships of twenty-five years ago, who does not feel his blood boil within him when he reads of such opprobrious epithets heaped upon the soldier, I pity him. It seems to me that there is not a single soldier with a thimbleful of the loyal blood of 1862-5, but what must say, "Such unappreciative, unsympathizing men, must and shall go out of office." Not so did they speak of us as we young men and older ones, marched from Camp Lincoln, Keokuk, to Prairie Grove, Vicksburg, Morganza Bend, and Spanish Fort. But the times have changed, those young men are growing old now, their hair has grown gray, their eye dim, their step trembles, and some of them after giving the best years of their lives are now in alms houses. They and their work seem to be fading out of sight, and forgotten. But comrades, let us come closer together and not forget one another. Let us join hearts and hands in resenting such foul imputations as were cast upon our unfortunate comrades recently in our halls of Congress. One by one our fellow soldiers are dropping out of the ranks of this world. While we have a voice left, let us lift it up to speak of their noble deeds, and leave at least this testimony as an inheritance to their children. As long as we can lift the pen let us write a word of tribute to the memory of our noble comrades that we left on southern fields of battle. As the living pass from us we should be ready to drop a tear of sympathy and remembrance at the open grave.

Comrades, we are growing old, and there is less and less prospect of the government we saved, now grown to plethoric riches, ever doing any very generous thing for our unfortunate comrades and their dependent families, but let us see to it that they go down to their grave with an honorable name. Will Spraker was noble-spirited and generous-hearted. He was brave in battle and did not loiter on the march. He stood privations like a hero. Probably because of these exposures and hardships he has gone prematurely



gomery County, Kentucky, January 15, 1816. She came with her parents to Indiana in 1921 and located 2½ miles north of Greensburg on what is now known as the Rev. Morgan farm on the Moscow pike, where the marriage took place. They set up housekeeping in a single-room log cabin, 18x18, one-half mile south and east of the marriage place on eighty acres of new land. She had two chairs, skillet, oven, churn, cow and some bedding. Charles⁴ had two horses, a cow, plow, and ax. He borrowed a two-inch auger and a drawing-knife. He constructed the bedstead in a corner of the room by boring holes in the logs of the cabin, using but one post. The tables and cupboards, bread and butter trays were made out of wood. I, their youngest child, remember these old trays. I wish they had been saved. The only piece saved, a butter ladle of blue ash, made so as to hang on a churn while in use, I now have. I have heard them say they were just as happy there as any time in life, looking forward to better things. They united with the Methodist Episcopal Church soon after marriage. They lived on this farm until after Grandmother Miller's death. Grandfather moved to Iowa in 1839. They sold the eighty-acre farm and bought the farm where Grandfather (George Miller) located when he moved from Virginia, where they continued to reside until father's (Charles Miller's⁴) death, which occurred on March 15, 1888, from paralysis. He lived about thirty-six hours after the stroke. Mother (Louisa Pleak Miller) continued at the same place with her youngest child, C. P. Miller,⁶ until her death, June 18, 1907. They are buried at Shiloh cemetery, which was deeded by George Miller³ for a cemetery. The Miller homestead is still in the Miller name and is now owned by Charles Ira Miller,⁶ son of Charles P. Miller,⁵ youngest child of Charles⁴ and Louisa Pleak Miller, the tenth child of George³ and Elizabeth Swope Miller.


